Environment, History, Customs, Beliefs







Okinawa is the largest island in this island chain.

This industry category is Okinawa's largest, accounting for 87% of the prefecture's economy.

Most electricity is generated on Okinawa using this type of commodity.

The average amount of rainfall water *per person* available on Okinawa is less than this percentage of amount *per person* in mainland Japan.

Education is mandatory for these ages, and the literacy rate of Okinawans is this percentage. Environment \$200 Answer

What is the Ryukyu island chain?

There are three main island groups (Okinawa, Miyako, and Yaeyama), and 500 island in the Ryukyu chain! 49% of the islands are inhabited. Environment \$400 Answer

What is the service industry? Manufacturing is 15% and agriculture 2% Unemployment is around 6% Okinawa is Japan's poorest prefecture Environment \$600 Answer

What is imported oil? **Okinawa Electrical Power Company is** investigating alternative sources like biomass, wind, and seawater hydroelectric power generation. There are no nuclear power plants on Okinawa

Environment \$800 Answer

What is less than 50% of mainland Japan? Okinawa's population density is three times higher than mainland Japan Also, the rate of domestic water use here is much higher than in Japan Water shortages are a real concern

What are 6-15 years and 99%? Japan's is a national education system Everyone goes to high school but that must be paid for High School cram schools keep kids up late at night studying for college entrance exams

Okinawa returned to full political control of Japan on this date. History \$200 Answer

What is China? **Okinawan people come from a mixture** of Southeast Asia, Mongolia, Japan, and Micronesia countries. Recently, a strong revival of Okinawaunique culture and identity has been promoted.

History \$400 Answer

What is 1879? While Okinawa had been invaded by Western Japan warlord clans from 1609, not until Commodore Perry's black ships and the Meiji restoration was the Ryukyu Kingdom forced to come under Japan's political rule.

History \$600 Answer

What is April 1 to June 23, 1945? June 1944, Japan dispatches soldiers to Okinawa October 1944, American bombing campaign begins March 1945, first American troops land on Kerama Americans killed or MIA= 12,500 Japanese military killed= approx 60,000 Okinawa civilians killed= approx 150,000 (one-third of their population)

History \$800 Answer

What is 1945 to 1952? Strong pacifist movement grew after the War. Almost the entire island's infrastructure and government was rebuilt during the occupation. Local governance returned to Okinawa in 1952 but only with limited autonomy, as Okinawa became central staging area for emerging Cold War in Asia

History \$1000 Answer

What is 15 May 1972? 1975- Okinawa International Ocean Exposition with Expo Park built in Nago 1995- Cornerstone of Peace erected in Itoman, Rape incident in Kin 2000- G-8 Summit held in Nago

Three of six body gestures typically used in America but considered rude in Japan are these. Customs \$200 Answer

What is slurping noodles? It is thought that slurping enhances the flavor and eating experience. It is also permissible to talk while eating, though usually one covers one's mouth while doing it. Customs \$400 Answer

What is karaoke? Even if you can't sing well, just the fact that you try will impress Japanese people. Karaoke machines are found in most bars and small eateries, but private "boxes" are the most popular now Almost all karaoke box sites have a large selection of American songs, which are very popular

Customs \$600 Answer

What is Golden Week and the Emperor's Birthday? Other interesting and unique holidays include Coming of Age Day (for 20 yearolds), Ocean Day, Boys' Day, Girls' Day, **Respect for the Aged Day, and Obon** (ancestral worship day)

Customs \$800 Answer

What is sticking them straight up in a bowl of rice, transferring food to someone else, or spearing food? Still, making an honest attempt to use chopsticks is a great sign of respect to Japanese people, so give it a try and watch others use them or just ask if you are unsure about something!

Customs \$1000 Answer

What is blowing one's nose in public, hands in pockets while speaking, pointing with the index finger, prolonged direct eye contact, dramatic arm and hand gestures, and distorting facial expressions? Still, don't be afraid to be yourself, just consider your actions' impact

The indigenous Okinawan martial art is called this.

This is the name for the ceramic animals found in front of almost all homes in Okinawa.

Beliefs \$200 Answer

What is karate? Remember "The Karate Kid?" (original version more than the Jackie Chan remake) Means "empty hand" Symbolic of Okinawans' general pacifist principles Introduced to mainland Japan in 1922

Beliefs \$400 Answer

What is shisa, or shishi. Also found in China and mainland Japan, but the use of two unique to Japan Different interpretations of their meaning, but mostly centered around controlling good and evil spirits Beliefs \$600 Answer

What is Shinto? Means "way of the gods." Not usually considered by most Japanese to actually be a religion but more a deeply ingrained part of the culture. All torii gates are Shinto in design. Most festivals in Japan are Shinto in origin. Beliefs \$800 Answer

What are tombs? Extremely popular in Okinawa, less so in mainland Japan. Unique Okinawan "turtle tomb" shape found everywhere on the island, including U.S. bases. Extremely important to be very respectful of these areas- are a main center of prevalent ancestor worship.

Beliefs \$1000 Answer

What is Shinto, Christian, and Buddhist?

In almost all aspects of life, the Okinawan (and Japanese) people are deeply spiritual, with a strong mix of various beliefs including: Animism, Shamanism, Shinto, Buddhism, Confucianism, Taoism.

Christianity only followed by 1-3%, Judaism and Islam even smaller, and mostly in urban areas.
