COMMANDING OFFICER'S  
VIOLENCE PREVENTION  
POLICY STATEMENT



It is III MIG policy to promote a safe environment for all of our members and for all those we work with. The Group is committed to partnering with its Marines, sailors and civilians to maintain a work environment free from acts of harassment, intimidation, threats of violence, and other disruptive behavior. While this kind of conduct is not pervasive within our Group, no unit is immune, and any act that compromises a professional work environment, impacts our readiness and makes us weaker as a team.

Violence prevention includes efforts to assess, investigate, mitigate and respond to behaviors that may precede acts of harassment, intimidation, threats, or violence, as well as behaviors consistent with radicalization and insider threats. Any type of behavior that puts our unit's members at risk, will not be tolerated. All reports of this type of behavior will be taken seriously and will be dealt with appropriately, including reporting possible crimes to the Provost Marshal's Office (PMO). Such behavior can include oral or written statements, social media statements, gestures, or expressions that communicate a direct or indirect threat of physical harm.

If a Marine, sailor or civilian makes a threat and/or commits an act of intimidation or violence that is substantiated by an appropriate law enforcement agency, or is found to be counter to good order and discipline, this command will take appropriate action using the full range of options available.

We will maintain a safe environment through command interest, education, and involved leadership. Therefore I need the cooperation of every member of the Group to implement this policy effectively and maintain a professional working environment. Do not ignore warning signs/indicators of potential violence or acts that put our service members at risk. If you observe or experience such behavior by anyone on the installation, whether he or she is a unit member or not, report it immediately through your chain of command, PMO, or to the Naval Criminal Investigative Service's (NCIS) Threat Management Unit (TMU). Leaders who receive such reports will seek advice from the Violence Prevention Officer (VPO) at 623-4661 regarding an inquiry into the situation and to initiate appropriate action.
